Week Beginning: 05/12/16

Nursery	
Reception	Next week we will be making Christmas cards and on writing day we will write a message to our families. We will continue to practise our Christmas show, if your child has a line/lines to learn we would be grateful if you could help them at home. For the show which will take place on Friday the 16th at 9.30am, we would like the children to have a costume. Matisse class need to wear something red and Mondrian need to wear something green. It would be great if you could bring their outfit into school in a plastic bag with the child's name on it by Friday the 9th. In maths we will focus on time/position and consolidate what we have been learning this term. Have a lovely weekend!
Year 1	<p>Maths: The children will be finding number bonds for 10 and adding two single digits by making ten first.</p> <p>Literacy/ R.E.: Identify main events in, 'The story of the Nativity'. The children will get another chance to use their skills to create a storyboard and retell a story.</p> <p>Geography: We will be looking closer at ways to travel around the world and asking why this way of travelling is the best way to visit a country.</p> <p>P.S.H.E.: We will ask and answer questions, make relevant contributions, offer suggestions and take turns.</p>
Year 2	<p>Maths: We will be learning the multiplication table of 5 and 10. The children will do this using skip-counting in 5s and 10s, as well as creating arrays. They will solve problems involving multiplication and division. <i>*This week, we have included a 5 times table poster in their homework. Please help them to practise at home.*</i></p> <p>Literacy: The children will be starting a new unit of work on "Rags to riches" stories. They will be learning to retell the story using a story map and will be taking part in lots of drama activities.</p> <p>Pantomime: We have a theatre company visiting the school on Thursday 8th December and the children will be watching the pantomime of Cinderella.</p> <p>Design and Technology Week: In the afternoons next week, the children will be designing and making their own animal glove puppets. They will be exploring different fabrics and investigating joining techniques (e.g. stapling, gluing, sewing, threading). If you have any unwanted buttons, sequins, furry material, wool etc. at home that we could use to decorate/finish our puppets, please send them in to class on Monday (5th). Many thanks!</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Children will practise measuring lengths to the nearest mm and cm and learn how to calculate the perimeters of 2D shapes.</p> <p>Literacy: Children will begin a new unit on 'Fairy Tales' and be introduced to their new story through actions.</p> <p>Science: Next week, children will complete an investigation relating to which materials best block light to form shadows.</p> <p>Topic: Children will continue to learn about Celtic weapons, clothing and beliefs.</p> <p>PE: Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice.</p> <p>PLEASE NOTE:</p> <p>*Next week, PE will be on <u>Monday, 5th December</u> so please ensure kits are in.</p> <p>** This half term, we have begun investigating how to maintain a healthy and varied diet. As part of our Design and Technology links, we will be baking healthy flapjacks/brownies next Tuesday afternoon! If any adults have spare tins for use on this day, it would be greatly appreciated. Thanks in advance!</p> <p>*** As part of our next Literacy unit on 'Fairy Tales', Year 3 will be visiting Alexandra Palace Ice Rink on Wednesday, 7th December (for 1pm) to watch Beauty and the Beast on Ice'. Permission slips have now been sent home. A gentle reminder that adults who are available to assist would be greatly appreciated. Please complete the back of the permission slip with your details if you are free to support us on this date or speak to the class teachers... Thanks!</p>
Year 4	<p>English –We will be beginning a new story.</p> <p>Maths – We will be continuing to look at data through line and time graphs.</p> <p>Science – We will looking at local habitat studies.</p> <p>P.E. - Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p>Swimming - Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Picasso will be swimming this Monday. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p> <p>Homework will include spellings, times tables and daily reading.</p>
Year 5	<p>Trips: On Monday 5th December we are going to the Victoria and Albert Museum for an Anglo-Saxon exhibition. Wednesday 7th December from 1pm, we are heading up to Alexandra Palace to watch 'Beauty and the Beast' on ice. If any parents/carers are available to come and support could you let either of us know!</p> <p>Maths: We will be exploring the four operations and strategies to solve problems related to each.</p> <p>English: We will write our own version of the fable story we have been looking at.</p> <p>Topic: We will investigate one of our local landmarks – Alexandra Palace.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to analyse the life-cycle of a human.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week. <u>Some children are still not bringing an appropriate change of kit for these lessons. Please ensure that PE kit is provided. This is a health and safety requirement.</u></p> <p>Swimming: Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits – 6th December – 5 Lowry.</p> <p>Homework / Spelling: <u>To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - Next week we will be continuing with angles - calculating angles around a point and studying area and perimeter of shapes.</p> <p>English- We will be exploring the techniques of diary writing and attempting some of our own.</p> <p>Topic - Continuing with our Viking study looking at Viking life.</p> <p>Please remind your child to bring a swimming kit to school on a Wednesday and a P.E kit on a Friday. Also spellings are handed out on a Monday and tested on a Thursday. Could you please encourage your child to learn their spellings as they make up a large number of the marks on the Grammar paper in May. Thank you!</p>
