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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 04/03/16

Reception	<p>In Reception next week we will be learning about the sculptor Henry Moore and creating our very own clay models. In Maths we will be consolidating our knowledge of 2-D and 3-D shapes. In Literacy we will be discussing animal patterns and reading Giraffes Can't Dance. Children will be writing about their favourite animal. We are looking forward to cooking club with our parents and would like to say a big THANK YOU to Wendy Shearer of Story Boat for an amazing Anansi story telling session last week. Have a good week! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Narrative – Fantasy stories. We will be reading <i>Where the Wild Things Are</i>, by Maurice Sendak. We will be discussing the setting and thinking about other stories fantasy stories. The children will then be creating their own fantasy settings which they will draw and then write sentences about.</p> <p>Maths: We will be completing the unit <i>Numbers to 40</i>: To apply addition and subtraction strategies, problem solving and adding or subtracting ones or tens.</p> <p>Topic: In science we will be continuing with our weather observations and comparing seasonal changes.</p> <p>Art: In art, we will be looking at the work of Andy Goldsworthy and designing our own sculptures using natural materials from our school environment.</p> <p>PSHE: We are doing a big push on politeness and good manners in class. It would be great if you could talk to your child about this at home too.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will continue to look at the use of descriptive language. Cheryl RML group will be practicing their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will begin to look at fractions. In Science we will be finding out what animals need to survive. In Geography we will be designing our own map using a grid reference. In Computing children will continue to develop their skills in coding. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: We will be continuing to work on multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000, using knowledge of place value to make links when multiplying and dividing.</p> <p>Literacy: <i>Non-Chronological Reports</i> - The children will be looking at the key features of non-chronological reports and using this knowledge to improve a given report. They will then begin to plan their own non-chronological report.</p> <p>Science: This week the children will plan their own experiment, in order to explore different parts of a plant and their functions.</p> <p>Topic: <i>Where does our food come from?</i> - We will be learning about the seasonality of different foods, as well as how food is grown and processed.</p> <p>Reminder: PE sessions take place on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please ensure your child has their kit in school on these days.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: This week we will be studying time using 12-hour and 24-hour clocks.</p> <p>English: We will explore characters.</p> <p>Science: We will start exploring the topic of Sound.</p> <p>Topic: We will be studying the topic of the Roman Empire.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments on the first week back.</u></p> <p>Homework: Homework will be given out on Friday. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesday. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p>
Year 5	<p>All of the Maya projects look amazing. A big well done to all of the children that completed and have presented their work to their peers.</p> <p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups;</p> <p><i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will read, write, order and compare numbers with up to 3 decimal places.</p> <p><i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will read and write five digit numbers.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will explore how decimals are used in relation to money and measurement (with a focus on mass).</p> <p>English: We will understand the features of some stories from Chinese culture and put the main themes into context.</p> <p>Science: We will examine the life cycle of a plant.</p> <p>Topic: We will continue to look at how the Mayas were ruled.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - Following on from the recent assessments, we will be focusing on areas of maths that the children are less secure in. We will also be working through previous SATs questions.</p> <p>English - Continue exploring how atmosphere is created by choice of language with a focus on Lemony Snicket.</p> <p>Topic - Continue the study of early Islamic civilisation - discovery and learning.</p> <p>Please make sure your child has the appropriate kit on Friday for swimming and P.E</p>
