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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 7/11/16

<b>Nursery</b>	<p>Next week we will be developing our theme 'Colour and Light' by making collections of different colours to photograph for a Rainbow Song class book. Our core book of the week will feature all the colourful animals in Brown Bear and we will have fun sequencing the story. We will also be drawing self-portraits and choosing our favourite colours to create a rainbow face display. In the dark tent, we will dare to read The Hairy Toe by torchlight. On Thursday Forest School continues and as usual, we will be cooking on Friday.</p>
<b>Reception</b>	<p>Next week we will be focusing on the celebration of Diwali. We will be making Divas out of clay and creating our own Rangoli and Mendhi patterns. In maths, we will be ordering objects from biggest to smallest and smallest to biggest. We will also estimate, compare and explore weight of everyday objects. Gradually we will be sending your child home with a phonics reading book, so please look out for them in your child's book bag. Remember to sign up for the cooking club we would love to have some volunteers to help us out! Have a lovely weekend!</p>
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> Year 1 children will listen to an African Folktale called, 'Too Much Talk' by Angela Shelf Medeiros. Then, they will identify the characters and main events in a story. Our focus for writing will be to create a story map, which we can use to write sentences and retell this story.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be continuing our work on shapes. The children will learn to describe and classify 2-D shapes, recognise and create repeating patterns. Next, they will begin to learn how to use the language of position, direction, and movement.</p> <p><b>ICT:</b> (Beebots) We will discover that control devices need to be programmed.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> <i>Outdoor learning</i> – We will make weather observations to help us record in our weather diaries.</p> <p><b>R.E.:</b> We will look at the Hindu use of Rangoli patterns and discuss why they are important.</p> <p><b>Geography:</b> We will begin to know the four countries, which make the UK.</p> <p>This term our P.E. days are on a <b>Thursday</b> and <b>Friday</b>. Book bags every day, please.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will begin a new unit of work on Measures. The children will be estimating, measuring and comparing lengths of objects using non-standard and standard units (cm and m).</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> The children are continuing to learn our new creation story (a story map is included in their homework this week). They will be considering how it has been written and the types of vocabulary and description that the author has used.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Continuing with our Habitats topic, we will be thinking about how plants and animals within a habitat depend on each other to survive.</p> <p><b>History:</b> We will be learning about how the Gunpowder Plot began and the problems that were encountered.</p> <p><b>Please note:</b> This half term, PE will be on a <b>Wednesday</b> and a <b>Friday</b>.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Children will be revising how to add and subtract numbers, where bridging is involved.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> Children will be practicing their actions to 'Lazy Jack', creating their own story maps and developing their understanding of text vocabulary.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week, children will be planning an investigation relating to which surfaces are best for reflection.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> Children will be learning about key events during the Bronze Age and placing them on a timeline.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice (revision of x2, x3, x4, and x5 times tables and the inverse/division).</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>English</b> – We will be continuing to explore our new story 'Hamelin' retelling using drama.</p> <p><b>Maths</b> – We will be multiplying 1 by 3 digit numbers.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> – We will be researching and studying ancient Greek gods and goddesses.</p> <p><b>Science</b> – We will be starting our new topic Living things and their habitats.</p> <p><b>P.E.</b> - Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p><b>Swimming</b> - Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Picasso will be swimming on Monday. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be learning about fractions (e.g. finding fractions of numbers, solving problems, equivalent fractions).</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will explore a new genre focusing on Fables.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will be learning about the history of Sutton Hoo and its relevance to the Anglo-Saxon period.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will research and investigate the life cycles of plants.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week.</p> <p><b>Swimming:</b> Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits - 8<sup>th</sup> November – 5 Lowry.</p> <p><b>Homework / Spelling:</b> <u>To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p>
<b>Year 6</b>	<p><b>Maths</b> - Next week we will be looking at the formal written methods of short and long division. We will then use these methods to solve word problems.</p> <p><b>English</b> - Continuing with our suspense story and exploring some of the techniques used to create tension and atmosphere.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> - We begin our study of the Vikings by recreating a timeline to explain when and where the Vikings came from and why they raided Britain.</p> <p><b>Science</b> - Continuation of human evolution.</p> <p><b>Homework</b> will be given on Mondays to be submitted on Friday morning.</p> <p><b>PE</b> has now changed to a Monday and swimming is on a Wednesday. Please, can you ensure your child has the correct kit in school.</p>
