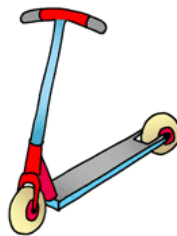
Well done and thank you to everyone that brought in coins and notes for our campaign. YOU have helped raised over £300 for the HSA!

NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 08/02/16

Reception	<p>Next week in reception we will be learning about The Little Red Hen and cooking some bread just like her with help from our lovely parents. In literacy we will be writing about our favourite traditional tale from this half term. In Maths we will be learning about positional language (e.g. under, next to, on). Please remember your book bags daily and make sure that your guided reading books are in your child's bag. If any parents have a spare hose you could donate, please let us know as we are looking for one for our outside area. Thank you so much! The Reception Team!</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Traditional Tales – Pinocchio: We are continuing to look at traditional tales this week. We will be using hot-seating and role-play to explore the characters further.</p> <p>Maths: We will be working with numbers within 40, represent a 2 digit number within forty on a place value chart and to find 10 more or ten fewer.</p> <p>Science: We will be reviewing what we have learned this half term about materials and their properties.</p> <p>Topic: We will be learning about the monument to the Great Fire of London.</p> <p>DT: Finishing off our fire carts and evaluating them.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie's Language and Literacy group will be looking at different ways of advertising. Christina's Literacy and Language group will be exploring characters thoughts and feelings. Cheryl's RML group will be consolidating their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will be assessing what the children have learnt during our unit of calculation strategies. In Science we will find out what the children know about our topic 'Uses of Everyday Materials'. We will be celebrating Chinese New Year this week (it is the year of the monkey). Don't forget: trip on Tuesday the 9th. No lunch needed, we will be back at school for lunch.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Multiplication and Division Problems - The children will be learning that multiplication can be done in any order. They will also be working on developing their understanding of multiplication and division as inverse operations.</p> <p>Literacy: Explanation Texts - We will be looking at the features of explanation texts and the children will then be writing their own explanation of the Water-cycle.</p> <p>Science: This week we will be investigating magnetic strength.</p> <p>Topic: The children will continue to investigate the Iron Age way of life and answer questions they generated at the beginning of our topic.</p> <p>Reminder: Please make sure your child practises their spellings each week, ready for the Spelling Challenge on Fridays.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: This week we will be working with square numbers and using multiplication facts.</p> <p>English: We will continue to analyse persuasive techniques in media including blurbs and film trailers.</p> <p>Topic: We will consolidate our learning and complete our work on the Ancient Greeks.</p> <p>Science: This week we will be analysing our fair tests on liquids and presenting results using a graph.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. <u>Some children are still not bringing an appropriate change of kit for these lessons.</u> Please ensure that PE kit is provided, as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: This will be a project to be completed during the next three weeks and due in on Wednesday 1st March. Each child is asked to make a model on any aspect of the Ancient Greece topic e.g. Greek dress (men, women, soldiers, and slaves), homes, 3D map of Ancient Greek vases, the Trojan horse etc.</p> <p>Just a reminder: Some children are bringing toys to play with into school. These are not needed.</p> <p>TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments every week.</u></p> <p>GREEK DAY: We will be having a Greek Day on Friday 12th February. Please encourage your child to dress up in an Ancient Greek tunic (Please do not go to any expense for this) and bring food to share, such as olives, hummus, pita bread etc.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be using the formal written method of short division to solve problems. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be converting between units to record capacity. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be practising /using the three times table and applying formal written methods to solving one and two step problems.</p> <p>English: We will be building dialogue that reveals information about how a character is feeling.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to enquire and raise different types of questions about how animals develop over time.</p> <p>Topic: We will draw comparisons regarding how the ancient Maya and Anglo-Saxons lived.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p> <p>Project: A letter has been sent out about a project that the children will have to undertake about the <u>Maya Civilization.</u> The date of submission is <u>Monday 29th February.</u> We look forward to the completed entries.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths – Using simple formulae, generating and describing linear number sequences and expressing missing number problems algebraically.</p> <p>English – We will explore the use of formal language and write letters of complaint.</p> <p>Science – Consolidate our knowledge of living things and their habitats.</p> <p>Topic – Continue to study the different types of weather that have an impact on our world.</p> <p>P.E and swimming kits must be brought in EVERY Friday.</p> <p>Can you please encourage your child to read, practise multiplication facts and use SATs Boot Camp to revise any areas that they are still finding difficult.</p>
