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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 09/05/16

Reception	<p>In Reception next week we will be continuing learning about 'In the Garden' and creating our own ladybirds in Expressive arts and design. We will also enjoy eating the cress that we grew last week. In Maths we will be learning about doubling and halving as a continuation of our grouping and sharing lessons. In Literacy we will be exploring maps and habitats and writing about secret hideaways. Cooking and Gardening clubs will continue as usual. Please sign up to Mondrian class for gardening at 1.30 pm on Fridays as there are currently some available slots. Have a great week! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: <i>Non-fiction Texts</i> – We will be looking at a variety of information books in order to learn more about space. The children will be posing their own questions and using the texts to find the answers. We will be identifying the features of information texts, such as contents pages and glossaries etc. and then creating a checklist. We will also be discussing key words for topics and their meanings, as well as looking at alphabetical order (in the context of glossaries and indexes).</p> <p>Maths: We will be comparing and ordering numbers within 100. Then, identifying the pattern in a sequence.</p> <p>Topic (Plants): In science, we will be looking at different types of trees and the bark which surrounds them.</p> <p>History: We are looking at ways to find out about the past by investigating Victorian pleasure gardens.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will use their character descriptions for a superhero story. In Maths Mastery we will recapping different strategies for subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions and shape. In Science we will be looking at what happens to plants in different locations and under different conditions. In Geography we find out what endangered means and look at animals that are endangered. In computing we will begin to look how to make a PowerPoint presentation. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: This week, the children will be solving word problems, comparing fractions, recognising equivalent fractions and adding/subtracting fractions.</p> <p>Literacy: The children will begin a new unit on Non-Chronological Reports. They will be identifying the features of these types of information texts and will start to plan their own reports based on our topic, Ancient Egypt.</p> <p>Science: The children will be looking at different types of rocks.</p> <p>Topic: We will continue to research what life was like in Ancient Egypt and we will be learning about Mummies.</p> <p>REMINDERS: PE kit is needed on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Our Spelling Challenge takes place every Friday. Homework is due back to school by Wednesday.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will continue our work on learning to interpret and present data using graphs.</p> <p>English: We will be describing the journey a character takes in our story from another culture, studying setting and the character's emotions.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to work on pitch in our Sound topic and what happens when sounds reach the ear.</p> <p>Topic: We will explore life in Roman Britain.</p> <p>PE: Please note the change of day to Wednesday and Friday for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: It is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. This will help considerably with their maths calculations. Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy. Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be multiplying mixed numbers with whole numbers. <i>Miss Whight:</i> We will be looking at decimals and fractions.</p> <p>English: We will be examining features of persuasive texts.</p> <p>Science: We will explore how mechanisms allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.</p> <p>Topic: We will look at some environmental issues in Alaska.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Next week is SATs week! You will receive a letter today, detailing the timetable for the week. To ensure your child performs to the best of their ability please follow the guidance below: Make certain that your child has a good night's sleep before each test day.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Start each day with a healthy breakfast. • Arrive on time each day (no later than 8:55am). • Encourage your child and support them in their revision until the tests are completed. <p>We have been really impressed by all the children's hard work over the past few weeks and wish them every success during the SATs!</p>
