Harvest Festival Assemblies

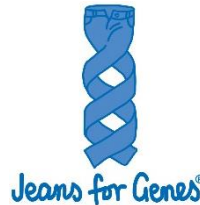
This year to make sure you have the opportunity to share in our Harvest Festival celebrations we are doing 2 assemblies on Friday 21st October 2016.

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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 10/10/16

Nursery	<p>Next week the Nursery are moving on to the rhymes 'Five currant buns' and 'Pat-a-cake'. Our core book will be Zed's Bread'. Naturally we will be making our own currant buns to share. Please remember our Tuesday parents/ carers meeting which will start at 3.45 promptly. See you there!</p>
Reception	<p>Continuing with our topic 'Marvellous Me', we will be using our senses to explore different objects. In maths we will be focusing on counting and estimating. For Literacy we will be talking and writing about our favourite hobbies. Please remember that Individual school photos will take place on Wednesday the 12th. We love to cook in Reception so please look out for our cooking tin, any donations would be grateful. Have a lovely weekend!</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: We will be discussing families. First, we will read, "Grace and Family" by Mary Hoffman. After, we will discuss Grace's family. Then, we will discuss our own family (size, siblings, uncles, aunts, grandparents etc.). Finally, we will write about our relationships with our family and what makes them special to us. Maths: We will identify the whole and the part in a subtraction equation, explore related addition and subtraction facts and find the total when adding to a set of objects. Black History Month: Year 1 Brooks class will be looking at the life and music of Ella Fitzgerald. Year 1 Riley class will be looking at the life and music of Bob Marley. Science: We will identify and name a variety of common birds. We are looking forward to meeting you at the Parent / Carer consultations!</p>
Year 2	<p>Maths: We will be starting a new unit of work on Addition and Subtraction Word Problems. The children will be using their knowledge of the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction to solve these. Literacy: The children will finish writing their version of The Papaya that Spoke. They will then begin to plan their own journey story. Science: This week the children will be exploring microhabitats and identifying mini-beasts. Topic: We will be identifying local landmarks and buildings on a map. Spelling Challenge is on a Friday. Please support your children to learn their spellings each week.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Children will compare, order and explore how to add and subtract 1000 from 4-digit numbers. Literacy: Children will use their planning to write their own version of a story involving trickery. Science: Next week, children will be identifying and naming the main bones in the body. Topic: Children will be learning about Skara Brae. PE: Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice. (X5 this week!)</p>
Year 4	<p>English – We will be innovating our own stories based on our study of 'Nail soup'. Maths – We will be using the bar method to consolidate our addition and subtraction learning. Science – We will be planning and conducting an experiment into the effects of different drinks on our teeth. Topic - We will be looking at the Olympics and their origin from Ancient Greece and how it differs from today. P.E. - Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday. Swimming - Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Sekoto will be swimming this Monday. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: The children will be identifying properties of 3-D shapes. English: We will create our own version of the story we have been exploring, 'The Canal'. Science: The children will be explaining the life cycle of a bird. Topic: We will discuss the appearance of an Anglo-Saxon. PE: Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week. Swimming: Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits. Next week's swimming is Lowry. Homework / Spelling: <u>To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - We will be exploring multiplication and division and solving problems. English - We will be reciting and creating warning stories using drama and published texts. Science - We will be continuing with evolution and inheritance focusing on Charles Darwin. Homework - Your child will be given spellings, a grammar book and a maths book on Monday. Please ensure the grammar homework is returned to school by Thursday.</p>
