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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 08/07/16

Reception	Next week Reception will be reading the story 'The Enormous Turnip' by Aleksey Nikolayevich Tolstoy. We will be discussing working as a team and root vegetables. In Literacy we will be writing about our favourite topic in Reception and in Maths we will be counting in 2s and 10s and writing the numbers on white boards. Cooking and gardening clubs will continue as usual. Please bring back any reading books you may have at home during this week. Many thanks and have a great week! The Reception Team.
Year 1	Literacy: Non-fiction – Recounts. This week we will be writing recounts about our trip to the London Aquarium. The children will be using time-connectives to help order the events within their writing. We will also be discussing how a good recount contains not just the main facts but also details that bring the recount alive. Maths: We are doubling and halving an amount, we are adding equal groups and beginning to understand repeated addition. Topic: In Science, we will be finishing our work on seasonal change and plants. PSHE: We will be discussing how we have changed this year and our expectations for Year 2. Can 1 Riley please bring in empty margarine tubs for D&T – thank you!
Year 2	Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be writing a fantasy story. We will be consolidating what the children have learnt in Maths Mastery. In our History lesson we be looking at air raid shelters and evacuations from World War 2. We will be doing a science assessment to complete our topic 'Plants'. In SRE we will look at the differences and similarities between boys and girls. In computing we will explore all the things we have learnt when using Microsoft Word. We will also be continuing to practice for our end of year show which is on Friday the 15 th . Hope to see you there!
Year 3	Maths: This week the children will be focusing on solving word problems involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions and measures. Literacy: We will be focusing on the key features of letter writing. The children will be writing a letter to their new teacher to introduce themselves. Science: In Science this week, we will be investigating soil permeability. Topic: The children will be learning about volcanoes and the impact of volcanic eruptions.
Year 4	Maths: We will consolidate our knowledge of maths concepts and skills. English: Develop and edit our stories inspired by a narrative poem - The Inchcape Rock by Robert Southey. SCIENCE: We will be exploring simple electrical circuits. TOPIC: We will be completing our activities on The Roman Empire. TRIP: Our end of year trip will be to Kew Gardens on Tuesday, 12th July. There will be no trip letters for parents. You should have received information on how to access the letter online and give your consent. Please contact the office if you are having difficulty. Concert: Sekoto class will be having a Trumpet and Clarinet Concert on Thursday 14th July. You are welcome to watch and encourage them Please remind your child to bring their instrument for that day.
Year 5	Maths: Mr Mattocks – We will investigate a range of methods to use to solve multiplication and division problems. Miss Whight – We will continue to examine information presented in graphs to solve problems. Mr Sharman – We will finish looking at statistics and develop our understanding of area and perimeter. English: We will be finishing our play-scripts. Topic: We will explore the summer Olympics that are taking place this summer. PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits. Homework: Will be given on Monday , to be handed in on Friday . Trip: Thank you to those parents who attended the trip on Thursday – it was a great day out!
Year 6	Your child has received their SATs results and the year 6 staff are extremely pleased with the high levels of achievement and would like to congratulate all the year 6 children for their hard work. We are looking forward to our end of year trip on Monday, please ensure your child arrives at school at 7:45 am. On Wednesday 13th July we will be having our year 6 prom, invites have been handed out, we are expecting the children to dress to impress!
