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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 13/06/16

Reception	<p>Next week in Reception we will be reading 'Revolt Rhymes' by Roald Dahl. We will be making a pizza and thinking about the horrible toppings we could put on it! The children will write about this in literacy exploring the provision and coming up with their own revolt rhymes. In maths we will be exploring measure including capacity and position. From next week please can you line your child up outside in the infant playground in the morning. Your child's teacher will collect the class from there. Many thanks and have a great week! The Reception Team</p>
Year 1	<p>Next week Year 1 children will be doing their phonics screening test. Literacy: We are writing facts about space and the solar system. Maths: We will recognise and compare the value of different coins and notes. Science: During science week we are going to be learning about the British astronaut Tim Peake, space and forces. Design and Technology: We will be designing and making stomp rockets and plastic cup launchers! PSHE: Our theme is Changes – we will talk about how some changes are natural and happen by themselves. Please send in large plastic water bottles (empty) and plastic cups for our science experiments.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be using the features of instruction writing to write their own instructions for someone else to follow. In Maths Mastery our topic is Multiplication of 3x and 4x tables. It is Science Week and the afternoons will be dedicated to investigating the topic of Space. We will be focusing on rockets and the planets. Don't forget your book bags every day!</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: The children will be finishing the unit of work on Angles. We will then begin our new unit on Length, Weight and Volume, during which the children will be reading weighing scales with different intervals as well as weighing and comparing masses with mixed units. Literacy: Next week the children will be planning, writing and editing their own poem about Summer, as part of our Poetry unit of work. Science: Next week is Science Week at Campsbourne! The children will be learning about Tim Peake and Space through a range of activities throughout the week. Reminders: PE sessions take place on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Homework is due in on Wednesdays. Please support your child to learn their spellings each week.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be studying properties of complex 2-D shapes. English: We will writing an explanation text. SCIENCE: We will be looking how we receive sound from the ear. PE: Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement. Homework: It is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. This will help considerably with their maths calculations. Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy. Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it. SCIENCE WEEK: We will be celebrating Science Week with a range of SPACE activities.</p>
Year 5	<p>Well done to all the Year 5 children that competed at the cricket tournament – you were fantastic! Maths: <i>Mr Mattocks & Miss Whight:</i> We will be re-exploring a range of areas of maths in preparation for assessment week. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be developing our understanding of division, including the use of the formal "bus stop" method to solve problems. English: We will continue to explore play-scripts. Science: We will be investigating the human digestive system. Topic: We will look at geographical vocabulary related to rivers. PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits. Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - Next week we will be using the four operations when problem solving with fractions. English - Exploring and re-enacting the scenes within the Shakespeare play 'Macbeth'. Science - Next week is dedicated to science! We will be focusing on space including the solar system and moon landings. Year 6 homework - Our current topic is the Olympics. We would like pupils to create an A4 poster focusing on information about one country that will be participating in the Olympics this year. We will be presenting the posters to each other in our topic lesson. This is due Monday 20th June.</p>
