### Black History Month

Campsbourne will be looking at different influential people during Black History Month.

- *Nursery and Reception* will be looking at the artists Hope Brooks and Corey Barksdale and creating some pieces of their work.
- *Year 1* will be continuing the portrait theme in art by drawing portraits of Bob Marley and Ella Fitzgerald. They will also be listening to her music and discussing quotes regarding equality, peace and harmony. The portraits will then be put into a decorated folder for display.
- *Year 2* will be learning about Bessie Coleman, who was the first African American to get an international pilots licence. We will be sequencing her life and exploring how she became a pilot. We will also discuss the difference she made for women and how she fought for the end of segregation.
- *Year 3* will be creating posters and multimedia presentations on famous black sportsmen and sports women. Specifically, we will be learning about Muhammed Ali, Tommie Smith and John Carlos.
- *Year 4* will be learning about poets Benjamin Zephaniah and Maya Angelou.
- *Year 5* will be researching children fiction writers, e.g. Malorie Blackman, John Agard and writing letters / diary entries / blurbs.
- *Year 6* will be looking at influential inventors and scientists.

# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 17/10/16

<b>Nursery</b>	Our topic Nursery Rhymes concludes with Miss Polly and Rock-a-bye Baby. Our core books will be The Elephant and the Bad Baby, and Eat up Gemma. To celebrate Black History Week, Belen and her Mummy will be coming in wearing traditional Ethiopian costumes and will share photos and memories of their recent trip to visit family. Please remember to sign and return your permission form for Forest School which will start on Thursday 3rd November.
<b>Reception</b>	Next week we will be focusing on Black History Month, we will be looking at the artists Hope Brooks and Corey Barksdale and creating some art pieces. In maths we will be continuing to count reliably to 10 and finding out what is one more than a given number. In writing we will be writing about what job we would like to have when we are older. Reception children will be taking part in a Haringey walk to school activity called 'Hari Bear's Big Adventure'. We have been given a route to walk from school to Alexandra Primary School which will take place this Monday at 9.20am. Have a lovely weekend!
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> We will be looking at two books next week, 'Rosie's Walk' and 'We're Going On a Bear Hunt'. Then, we will be describing our journey to school. This is linked to our geography topic, where we will be looking at London landmarks and local landmarks.</p> <p><b>Mathematics:</b> We will be adding or subtracting by counting on and back, finding the difference between two numbers and looking back at all we have learned during this unit.</p> <p><b>P.S.H.E.:</b> We will be discussing our friendships at school and putting together a recipe, which might help us to recognise a good friend.</p> <p><b>R.E.:</b> It is time for our Harvest celebrations. So, we will look at the source of many foods, discuss why this celebration is important and compose a Harvest poem.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will be looking at what humans need to stay healthy, and finding similarities and differences between humans and other animals.</p> <p><b>P.E. kits</b> are needed for <b>Mondays</b> and <b>Thursdays</b>. Book bags every day please.</p> <p><b>A reminder:</b> Are you able to send in food for our Harvest festival?</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be continuing our unit of work on Addition and Subtraction Word Problems. The children will be using their knowledge of the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction to solve these.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> The children will write their own journey story. They will think about their main character encountering a problem and deciding how to solve the problem. Their main character will also go on a journey.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> This week the children will be exploring habitats around the world and identifying why living things choose to live there.</p> <p><b>Art Week:</b> We will be looking at our class artist and producing some work in style of Georgia O'Keeffe and George Seurat.</p> <p><b>Black History Month:</b> This week we will be looking at Bessie Coleman and finding out why she is remembered today.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Children will round 4-digit numbers to the nearest multiple of 1000 and apply their place value knowledge to solve problems.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> Children will invent their own original version of a story involving trickery.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week, children will be learning about the functions of the skeleton and understand how muscles allow movement.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> Children will be learning about Stone Age art and will be creating their own Cave Paintings.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice. (x6 this week!)</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>English</b> – We will be inventing our own trickery stories using all the tools we have learnt over the past 4 weeks.</p> <p><b>Maths</b> – We will be using the bar method to assist us with two step word problems.</p> <p><b>Art Week</b> – Our afternoons will be focused on our artist projects as well as beginning to design our country calendar.</p> <p><b>P.E.</b> – Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p><b>Swimming</b> – Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Picasso will be swimming this Monday. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> The children will be converting between different measurements. On <b>Friday 21<sup>st</sup> October</b>, the children will be making a pizza with a focus on measuring out ingredients, which the children will have to bring in. A letter will out go next week providing more information.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will be writing our own version of the story we have been exploring, 'The Canal'.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will explore what life was like for the average Anglo-Saxon in their villages and how they lived day to day.</p> <p><b>Black History Month is currently being celebrated too</b> – our theme is black authors who have made a significant difference to their profession.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week.</p> <p><b>Swimming:</b> Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits. Next week's swimming is Warhol.</p> <p><b>Homework / Spelling:</b> <u>To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p> <p><b>Parents Evening:</b> Thank you to all parents that attended, we had two great evenings.</p>
