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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 14/11/16

Nursery	Continuing with our topic Colour and Light, we will be learning a new colour song and dance. We will also be experiencing the colours of Autumn in the woods as we go on a Forest School bear hunt on Thursday. We're Going on a Bear Hunt and The Bear Under the Stairs are our books of the week. On Friday the children are encouraged to bring in a bear from home to join our teddy bear's picnic.
Reception	Next week we are focusing on the celebration of 'Birthdays'. We will be writing our own birthday list of things we would like to have at our birthday party. We will also be baking our own yummy birthday cake! In maths, we will be focusing on ordinal numbers and problem solving. Please remember your child to bring in their book bag to school every day. Have a lovely weekend!
Year 1	<p><b>Literacy:</b> We will listen to the story, <b>'The King of the Playground'</b>. Then, we will look closely at the differences between the two main characters. Finally, we will write sentences which describe each character. (Linked to anti-bullying week).</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will begin to use the language of position, direction and movement. This includes, solving puzzles by using the words <i>'left, right, above, forward, between, on top of, and turn'</i>.</p> <p><b>Geography:</b> We will continue our work on aerial views and will look at a view of the city of Cardiff.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will make further observations of weather, with a focus on rain.</p> <p><b>P.S.H.E.:</b> The Anti-Bullying theme for this year is, <b>'Power for Good'</b>. We will be discussing, <b>'The Power of One'</b> drama show we have seen this week, and completing some anti-bullying activities to show how we can act affectively against bullying, on our own and together. (Anti-bullying week is 14<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup> November 2016)</p> <p><b>D.T.:</b> We will look at what a kite is and then begin to design a small kite.</p>
Year 2	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be completing our unit of work on Measures. The children will be measuring, drawing and comparing lengths in centimetres, using rulers and measuring tapes. They will also be solving problems involving length.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> The children will be writing their own version of the creation story, <i>How the World was Made</i>. They will be adding their own description and similes to the story.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week, we will be learning about Food Chains.</p> <p><b>History:</b> The children will be sequencing the events of the Gunpowder Plot.</p> <p><b>Reminders:</b> PE is now on <u>Wednesday</u> and <u>Friday</u>. <b>Spelling Challenge</b> takes place every <u>Friday</u>.</p>
Year 3	<p><b>Maths:</b> Children will be learning how to add and subtract 3-digit numbers using the column method (with regrouping).</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> Children will begin innovating the story of 'Lazy Jack' by replacing events/characters with their own ideas and creating their personalized story maps.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week, children will be conducting an experiment to investigate which surfaces are best for reflection.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> Children will be learning about roundhouses and their importance.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice (x7 tables this week!)</p>
Year 4	<p><b>English</b> – We will be begin to innovate new ideas for our tales of revenge.</p> <p><b>Maths</b> – We will moving on to complex multiplication and division problems using the skills we have learnt and also attempting tricky word problems.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> – We will be researching and studying the Trojan War.</p> <p><b>Science</b> – We will classifying vertebrates as part of our new module.</p> <p><b>P.E.</b> – Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p><b>Swimming</b> – Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Picasso will be swimming this Monday due to unforeseen cancellation in previous week. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p> <p><b>Homework</b> – Will be due in on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>, this includes spellings, times tables and daily reading.</p>
Year 5	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be learning about decimal numbers (e.g. order and compare numbers with up to three decimal places, round decimals, solve problems)</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will be creating and acting out a story map of The Ants and the Grasshopper fable and learning key vocabulary from the story.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will summarise and revise our Anglo- Saxon topic.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will research and investigate the life cycles of plants focusing on non-flowering ones.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week.</p> <p><b>Swimming:</b> Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits - 8<sup>th</sup> November – 5 Warhol.</p> <p><b>Homework / Spelling:</b> To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following <b>Friday</b>. Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p>
Year 6	<p><b>Maths:</b> We are studying the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages and learning how to calculate each one and solve SATs problems.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We are continuing to explore the features of suspense writing and develop our own suspense story.</p> <p><b>Science</b> - We will be continuing with evolution and inheritance focusing on adaptation.</p> <p><b>Homework</b> - Your child will be given spellings, a grammar book and a maths book on Monday. Please ensure the grammar homework is returned to school by Thursday. Thank you for your continued support.</p>
