

NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 19/07/16

Reception	<p>All children are settling in well in to Reception so far. This half term we are focusing on ourselves and our families. It would be great if you could bring in a family photo which we could display in our classroom. We have started to give out free choice reading books which the children can take home, so please make sure your child brings a book bag to school every day. Next week we will continue to have lots of circle times, where we will play games/sing songs to get to no one another. We will also be talking about our classroom/golden rules. We hope you have a lovely weekend!</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy – We will be writing a character description based on The Gruffalo. Our focus will be to use interesting vocabulary. Maths – We will be exploring sequences of number and objects, recognising the ordinal position of objects and representing the parts and the whole in a number bond. Science – In science we will be learning what a Carroll diagram is and using one to sort animals. Geography – We will be using a map to recognise and locate areas in our school. RE – We are identifying the key symbols of main religions of the world. PSHE– We will be recognising, naming and dealing with our feelings in a positive way. Art – We will be looking at portraits and drawing our own. Please ensure your child has a P.E. kit at school for Mondays and Thursdays and their book bag every day.</p>
Year 2	<p>Maths - This week we will be finding ten more or ten less than a given number. We will also be counting on and back in 10's, 5's and 3's and problem solving using place value. Literacy - We will be starting a new unit of work based on The Papaya That Spoke. Children will be learning to retell the story orally using a story map and actions. Science - The children will be finding out about different habitats in the local environment. Geography - We will be creating maps to show our journey to school. Reminder - Our P.E days are on a Tuesday and Wednesday, please make sure your child has their P.E kit with them.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Children will be exploring the number system, including understanding place value, applying their knowledge of number bonds and adding and subtracting multiples of 10 and 20. Literacy: Children will be introduced to a new narrative story which involves trickery between characters. Science: Our new unit for this term will be 'Animals Including Humans'. Next week, children will be learning about why living things need food and how they obtain it. Topic: We will be learning about the Stone Age and creating a timeline of key dates. PE: Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays (swimming commencement TBC). Please support your children with regular reading, homework and times table practice. ** REMINDERS**: To introduce our new Literacy unit next week, the children will be getting involved and making soup on Monday the 19th! If there are any adults who would like to contribute ingredients to assist with our making of tomato and chicken soups, it would be greatly appreciated! (Cooked chicken, tomatoes, veg, bread, plastic bowls etc). Thanks in advance. The Year 3 parent evening will be on Thursday, 22nd September. Please ensure slips have been returned to class teachers. We look forward to seeing you then.</p>
Year 4	<p>In maths we will be exploring the place value of four digit numbers applying reasoning to calculations. In English we will be identifying and analysing a character flawed text, focusing on turn points in stories. During Topic we will be developing our geographical understanding of Europe in an exploration of the Ancient Greek Empire in all its glory. For Science this week we will be continuing to study the complexity of the digestive system focusing on individual organs and their functions. PE kits will be required for Friday morning (Sekoto & Picasso). Sekoto will also require their PE Kits on Monday afternoon, whilst Picasso will need to bring swim kits on this day. * Library books required for Wednesday</p>
Year 5	<p>Numeracy: We will be working on place value identifying the value of digits and ordering and sequencing numbers. Literacy: We will be begin a new unit of work on a 'warning story'. Science: We will begin to study the topic of Living Things and their Habitats focusing on Life Cycles. Topic: We will start work on our topic of The Anglo-Saxons. PE: Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week. Swimming: Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits. Homework / Spelling: <u>To be handed out on Monday and needs to be returned on Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p>
Year 6	<p>We would like to say a huge thank you to the staff who took the year 6 children to Pendarren, they all had a brilliant time! In maths we shall order and compare numbers up to a million and beyond and determine the value of each digit. In English we will be working on settings and creating mood and atmosphere. In science we are starting our topic on evolution and inheritance. Our topic this term is based around California. Please ensure your child has a swimming kit for Wednesday and PE kit for Friday, many thanks.</p>
