We then lost against Rhodes Avenue, to then play a tight game against Coldfall for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Sadly we lost 2-3 but the team played some fantastic netball and were wonderfully sporting on and off the court.

Thirty children took part in a Sports Day organised by Highgate Wood School at the New River sports Centre. We entered a tennis team, a Games team and an Athletics Squad. The Games team did well coming second playing Rounders and Tag Rugby. | <b>Reception</b> | <p>Next week in Reception we will be reading the story <i>The Bear and the Picnic Lunch</i> by Sarah Hayes. We will be making our own sandwiches for a picnic lunch of our very own. In Maths we will be learning about numbers greater than 20 and less than 50. We will also be counting in 2s and 10s. In Literacy we will be writing about our favourite picnic food and we will be creating our own craft picnic blanket using prints. The reception trip this year is on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> July to Willow's Farm. Trip letters will be available soon. Have a great week! The Reception Team.</p>   |
| <b>Year 1</b>    | <p><b>Literacy:</b> Poems on a theme – We will be reading poems on the theme of the sea and the seaside. The children will be generating their own words related to the theme, as well as identifying effective words used in the poems that they have read. The children will be writing their own verse for a poem. We will also be exploring rhyming words.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be comparing different amounts of money, using addition and subtraction in the context of money and finding the total cost of two items.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will be looking at flowering plants around our school, naming them and recording them onto a frequency chart.</p> <p><b>Geography:</b> We are finding out about people who live in the Arctic (Inuits).</p> <p><b>D&amp;T:</b> We will be looking at different types of boats and what they are used for.</p>  |
| <b>Year 2</b>    | <p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be looking at how to write a fantasy story. We will continue to focus on multiplying by 3 and 4 in Maths Mastery. In Science will be following up our investigation of growing plants in different locations to see what has happened. In our History lesson we be looking at the impact of rationing and creating our own poster to encourage people to grow their own vegetables. In computing we will writing a letter to our partner school in Spain to tell them about our mosaic work. We also be starting to practise for our end of year show.</p>  |
| <b>Year 3</b>    | <p><b>Maths:</b> Length, weight and volume - We will be reading scales with different intervals and estimating, weighing and comparing masses with mixed units. The children will also begin to measure volume.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> The children will begin a new unit of work on Myths and Legends. We will be studying a variety of myths and legends and identifying the key features of these types of texts.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week the children will be learning about palaeontology and describing how it has changed our understanding of prehistoric animals.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> On Friday (24th June), Year 3 will be having an 'Egyptian Day' to round off our topic on Ancient Egypt. The children may come to school dressed as Ancient Egyptians on this day if they wish to.</p> <p>*Please remember to return your child's permission slip for our end of year trip. We need some parent helpers for the trip - if you are available, please talk to your child's class teacher as soon as possible.*</p> |
| <b>Year 4</b>    | <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be studying decimal tenths and hundredths</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will editing and evaluating our explanation texts.</p> <p><b>SCIENCE:</b> We will start exploring the topic of Electricity.</p> <p><b>TOPIC:</b> We will be learning about the legacy of Roman Empire in Britain.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> It is vital that your child learns <b>ALL</b> tables to x12. <u>This will help considerably with their maths calculations. <b>Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy. Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</b></u></p> <p><b>TRIP:</b> Please ensure you return your permission letter to the office by <b>Monday</b>.</p>  |
| <b>Year 5</b>    | <p><b>Maths:</b><br/><i>Mr Mattocks &amp; Miss Whight:</i> We will be continuing to explore a range of areas of maths in preparation for assessment week.<br/><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will continue to develop an understanding of division and the use of the 'bus stop' method and begin to interpret bar charts.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will investigate the play-script of 'Excalibur'.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will examine how humans develop over time.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will discuss how rivers are formed.</p> <p><b>PE: Monday and Tuesday.</b> On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Will be given on <b>Monday</b>, to be handed in on <b>Friday</b>.</p>  |
| <b>Year 6</b>    | <p><b>English:</b> We will be focusing closely on Shakespeare's <i>Macbeth</i>. We will be doing some role play, persuasive writing and persuasive speech performances.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be learning about measurement including volume and capacity.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will be focusing on the various sporting events at the Olympics. We will present our posters about the countries who will participate in the 2016 Olympics. We will consolidate all that we have learnt in a performance.</p> <p><b>Year 6 Homework:</b> We would like pupils to create a fact file about one athlete who will be competing in the 2016 Olympics. We will be presenting the fact files to each other in our topic lesson. The fact file is due on Monday 27th June.</p>   |
