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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 21/03/16

Reception	<p>In Reception next week we will be learning about the artist Kandinsky and drawing our own concentric circles. In Maths we will be learning about numbers to 20 and saying what is one more or one less than a given number to 20. In Literacy we will be writing about our favourite animal and creating pictures of the patterns of the animal of our choice. E.g. Zebra, tiger. We will be having a fabulous story telling session on Wednesday by one of our parents who is a professional story teller so we are looking forward to this. Please continue to bring your book bags every day and we look forward to seeing your costumes on World Book Day (Friday 4th March). The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: We are exploring information texts to explain the parts of a plant. Maths: We will be measuring using standard units of length, solving problems that involving doubling and halving lengths and comparing the weights of three objects. Topic: Identifying and labelling parts of a plant. Art: In art, we will be evaluating our sculptures in the style of Andy Goldsworthy and discussing how we could improve them. PSHE: We will be continuing to talk about and explore what makes us feel proud.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be assessing children's comprehension skills. Cheryl's RML group will be practicing their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will continue to look at fractions. In Science we will be finding what the children have learnt during our topic 'Animals Including Humans'. In Geography we will be looking at a grid reference map of London and identifying famous buildings. In Computing children will continue to develop their skills in coding. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: The children will be learning how to divide numbers by 2, 3, 4 and 5 (with and without regrouping) and investigating division word problems. Literacy: As part of our work on 'Instructions', children will be baking muffins next Tuesday and then they will create a piece of writing to explain all about it. (Please note: Basic ingredients will be supplied by the class teachers. Any additional decorations/fruit for children's creations are optional and will need to be supplied by parents/carers). Topic: Investigating food miles and trade import/export.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be working on subtracting numbers up to 4 digits using formal written methods and calculating 2 step problems English: We will continue to study non-fiction writing and how radio interviews are written and conducted. Science: We will continue to study sound and how it travels to us. Topic: We will be studying the topic of the Roman Empire. PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement. TRUMPET & CLARINET: Picasso Class will have their music concert on Tuesday. That will bring these sessions to an end for this term. They will continue again after the Easter break, Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments on the first week back.</u> It was lovely to meet parents this week and we appreciate your continued support! Thank you.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be solving problems about percentages. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be identifying 3D shapes and recognising their properties. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will continue to explore the different properties of quadrilaterals and triangles (including symmetry). English: We will be continuing our story with an encounter that creates tension. Science: We will discover how unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity. Topic: We will continue to discuss Alaska and some of the major problems that it is facing. PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits. Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Next week we will continue to work our way through various SATs questions in English and mathematics, focusing on strategies to help the children complete the tests. We enjoyed meeting all of you this week and appreciate your support, however we have five school weeks to go so please ensure your child continues to read every day and revise areas of maths and grammar through SATs Boot Camp.</p>
