



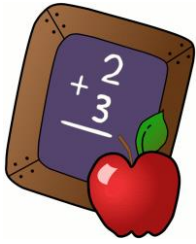

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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 25/01/16

Reception	In reception this week we will be learning about Hansel and Gretel continuing our theme of traditional tales. In Literacy we will be learning about list writing. The children will write out a list of their favourite sweets. Yum! In Maths will be continuing to count within 10 and learn about one less and one fewer than a given number. We will create lovely dances in PE and enjoy mono printing in expressive arts and design. Please can children remember their book bags daily so that we can change their reading books. Thank you! The Reception Team
Year 1	<p>Literacy - Narrative: Three Little Pigs – we will be focusing on retelling the story in the correct sequence and using storybook language.</p> <p>Maths – We are learning to tell the time – o'clock and half past, measure time in seconds and know the order of the months of the year.</p> <p>Science – We will be looking at the materials that different objects are made from and we will be beginning to think about why that material has been used (properties etc).</p> <p>DT – Start to make our fire carts.</p> <p>Topic – We will be writing our own version of "London's Burning".</p>
Year 2	Julie's Language and Literacy group will be looking at adverts and the power of words. Christina's Literacy and Language group will be exploring non-chronological information texts. Cheryl and Debbie's RML groups will be practising their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will assess what children have learnt in the multiplication and division unit and start the new topic of exploring calculation strategies. We are going to be investigating the best material for the bottom of children shoes. We start to look at another influential women in history: Elizabeth Fry. In Computing children will continue to code using Espresso. In Art we will be looking at and adding detail to our drawing of iconic London buildings. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag. P.E kits as always on Wednesday.
Year 3	<p>Maths - Length and Perimeter: The children will be measuring length in centimetres and millimetres. They will also calculate the perimeter of 2D shapes.</p> <p>Literacy - Poetry: We will be reading and performing a variety of poems, as well as discussing poetic features and language.</p> <p>Science - The children will be learning about magnets.</p> <p>Art - As part of our Iron Age topic, we are looking at Celtic art and weaving. Please could you send in any spare strips of material or ribbon that you may have, so that we can use them in our weaving.</p> <p>Spellings - Please can you support and encourage your child to practise their spellings. These are sent home on a Friday and the children have a spelling challenge the following Friday. Many thanks for your support!</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: This week we will be working with mass and decimals notation.</p> <p>English: We will be writing a short playscript based on drama stories from our topic.</p> <p>Topic: We will learn about Ancient Greek Olympics and we will explore the Greek alphabet.</p> <p>Science: We will be exploring the structure of a fair test.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. <u>Some children are still not bringing an appropriate change of kit for these lessons. Please ensure that PE kit is provided.</u> This is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: Homework will be given out on Fridays. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesdays. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p> <p>TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments every week.</u></p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Ms Edgar:</i> We will continue to measure and identify different angles. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be multiplying, applying the formal written method. <i>Mr Sharman and Mr Mattocks:</i> We will learn and use the eight times table and find fractions of amounts.</p> <p>English: We will be writing out a set of instructions about how to be an effective story writer.</p> <p>Science: We will introduce our new science topic which is on 'Animals including humans'.</p> <p>Topic: Our new topic is on The Maya Civilisation – the children will be locating the area that they came from on a world map.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Literacy – We will be doing diary entry tasks.</p> <p>Maths – We will be learning about time.</p> <p>Science – We will be studying micro-organisms.</p> <p>Topic – We will be looking at Tsunamis for our topic work.</p>
