



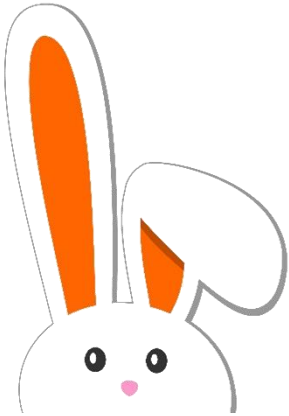

Medication in School

Non-prescribed medicines

The school will not be able to store or give medicines that have not been prescribed to a child (e.g. Calpol, Piriton or cough medicines). Please make arrangements to come into school if you wish to give your child these medicines.

Prescribed medicines

If medicines are prescribed up to 3 times a day, the expectation is that parents or carers will give these medicines outside of school hours. If medicines are prescribed 4 times a day, the school strongly encourages parents or carers to make arrangements to come into school to administer these medicines themselves. Parents and carers will definitely be required to administer the first 24 hour dose of any new prescription, for example antibiotics.

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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 11/04/16

Reception	<p>After the Easter Break we will be learning how to add and subtract within 20 in maths. In Literacy we will be reading stories about growing, and drawing and labelling a plant. We will be creating our own leaf prints and continuing cooking club as usual. Please sign up for the new half term if you are available. Happy Holidays!</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Narrative – we will be reading <i>The Man on the Moon</i>, by Simon Bartram. We will be generating adjectives to describe an alien that has been spotted on the moon. We will use hot seating to ask and answer questions about each character in the story.</p> <p>Maths: We will be continuing to explore and investigate weights, lengths and measures.</p> <p>Topic: Our new topic this half term is <i>The Victorians</i>. We will be introducing our new topic and the children will be generating questions that they would like to find out the answers to over the course of the half term.</p> <p>Science: We are finding out about what plants need to grow.</p> <p>PSHE: Our topic is <i>Relationships</i> and we will be discussing how our behaviour affects others.</p> <p>We hope that you all have a restful Easter holiday.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be looking at and using the techniques to write recounts. Cheryl's RML group will be practising their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will be developing the children's knowledge of fractions. We will have a new Science topic 'Plants'. We will begin our History topic 'Customs, festivals and fairs from around the UK' by looking at well dressing. In computing we will be handling data. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday. We hope you have a wonderful break.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: We will be starting a new Maths unit on Time. The children will learn how to read and tell the time to the nearest minute, on both analogue and digital clocks.</p> <p>Literacy: We will be exploring adventure stories. The children will be looking at the features of adventure stories and will then be planning and writing their own.</p> <p>Topic: Our new topic for next half term will be <i>The Egyptians</i>.</p> <p>Reminder: Please ensure P.E. kits are in school for Wednesdays and Thursdays.</p> <p><i>We hope that you all have a very restful Easter holiday and we look forward to seeing you all in the Summer term!</i></p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be working on multiplication problems and the inverse (division).</p> <p>English: We will be studying a story from another culture.</p> <p>Science: We will explore pitch and volume in our Sound topic.</p> <p>Topic: We will explore the spread of the Roman Empire and the related timeline.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: Please encourage your child to read daily during this Easter holiday and discuss the text. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p> <p>We would like to wish all families a happy holiday.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups;</p> <p><i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be ordering and comparing six digit numbers.</p> <p><i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be multiplying numbers mentally drawing upon known facts.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be developing our understanding of measures with a focus on mass, reading and interpreting scales.</p> <p>English: We will be reading and writing a non-chronological report based on a mythical creature.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to explore how unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity.</p> <p>Topic: We will use information and raise questions about Alaska.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths: We will continue our preparation for SATs by working through papers addressing any misconceptions as we go.</p> <p>English: We will focus on interpreting the writer's choice of language when analysing poems.</p> <p>Science: Understand how nutrients are transported around the body.</p> <p>The children have been given homework over the Easter break. This must be handed in on Monday 11th April (first day back). Also can you please continue to encourage your child to read every day and revise any areas in maths/grammar that they are still struggling with. Have a fantastic break!</p>
