



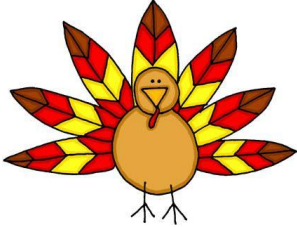

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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 28/11/16

<b>Nursery</b>	Our key story is going to be 'Can't You Sleep Little Bear' which is a great starting point for size comparisons and reflecting on our own feelings about the dark. We will look at an old fashioned lantern and make our own lanterns which will decorate the home corner in the run up to Christmas. A dark cosy Bear cave filled with teddies of different sizes will be set up outside. We will open the first door on our Advent calendar on Thursday and continue to practice for the Christmas show. There will be a box in the Nursery for contributions for the Christmas Bazaar. All donations gratefully received!
<b>Reception</b>	Next week we are focusing on the celebration of 'Hanukah'. We will be making our own menorahs and writing about how we made them. In maths we will be ordering numbers 1 to 10 (extending to 20) and problem solving. Please look out for our money tin, any donations towards cooking ingredients would be grateful! Have a lovely weekend.
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> The children will be writing a description of what they see, smell, hear or can touch, <b>'Behind the door...'</b> First, we will discuss the different types of fantasy worlds we know, such as the world found through the wardrobe in the Narnia story, the chocolate factory in Charlie and the Chocolate factory, or the deck of a Pirate ship. Then, we will plan and write a description, and focus on our use of adjectives.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be continuing with skills, which will find them counting beyond 10. We will use place value to recognise numbers up to 20, compare numbers to 20 and create patterns with numbers within 20.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will observe the leaves of trees, collect some and sort them. The children will decide their own criteria for sorting titles, such as <i>'big and round'</i> or <i>'thin and pointy'</i>.</p> <p><b>P.S.H.E.:</b> The whole class will create and share writing an anti-bullying poem.</p> <p><b>R.E.:</b> We will look at the Christian festival of Christmas.</p> <p><b>Geography:</b> We will begin to know some famous landmarks in the capital of Scotland -Edinburgh.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Next week the children will be learning about multiplication and division fact families. We will also be practising our 2 and 5 times tables, using skip-counting (in 2s and 5s), doubling and drawing arrays to help us. <i>*We have included a 2 times table poster in their homework, to help them practise at home.*</i></p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> The children will be using their plans, story maps and toolkit from this week to write their own Creation Story.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> As our Habitats topic comes to an end, the children will be reflecting upon what we have learnt and will apply this knowledge to answer questions they generated at the start of term.</p> <p><b>History:</b> We will be using role-play to act out scenes from The Gunpowder Plot.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Children will be solving addition/subtraction word problems and then begin a new unit on 'Length and Perimeter'.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> Children will plan and invent their own version of a story with a character flaw.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> Next week, children will plan an investigation relating to which materials best block light to form shadows.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> Children will continue to learn about Celtic weapons, clothing and beliefs.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice.</p> <p><b>*** As part of our next Literacy unit on 'Fairy Tales', Year 3 will be visiting Alexandra Palace Ice Rink on Wednesday, 7th December ( for 1pm) to watch 'Beauty and the Beast on Ice'. Permission slips will be sent home in the next week. Any adults who are available to assist would be greatly appreciated. Please complete the back of the permission slip with your details if you are free to support us on this date. Thanks!</b></p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>English</b> –We will be inventing our own tales of revenge.</p> <p><b>Maths</b> – We will be continuing to look at data through pictograms and bar charts.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> – We will be drawing and designing our Greek inspired pottery.</p> <p><b>Science</b> – We will learning to understand and create classification keys.</p> <p><b>P.E.</b> - Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p><b>Swimming</b> - Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Sekoto will be swimming this Monday due to unforeseen cancellation in previous week. PLEASE REMEMBER SWIMMING HATS.</p> <p>Homework will include spellings, times tables and daily reading.</p> <p>PICASSO TRUMPETS WILL BE BACK ON THIS WEEK</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p>Well done to all children who participated in assessment week – we are very proud of you all.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be solving worded problems related to time.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will continue to create our own version of 'The Ants and the Grasshopper' fable story by gathering and sharing ideas.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will plan a route of a walk around our local area using 'Google Maps'.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will start learning about life-cycle of a human.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week. <u>Some children are still not bringing an appropriate change of kit for these lessons. Please ensure that PE kit is provided. This is a health and safety requirement.</u></p> <p><b>Swimming:</b> Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits – 29<sup>th</sup> November – 5 Warhol.</p> <p><b>Homework / Spelling:</b> <u>To be handed out on Friday and needs to be returned on the following Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p> <p><b>Trip:</b> <u>Please remember to return slips to the office as soon as possible. Also, if any parents would like to support classes, could you please fill in the back of the letter.</u></p>
<b>Year 6</b>	<p><b>Maths</b> - Next week the children will be: finding unknown angles in triangles, quadrilaterals and regular polygons, identifying and name angles where they are vertically opposite, identifying and name angles where they meet at a point, are on a straight line, or are vertically opposite and finding missing angles whilst expressing relationships algebraically.</p> <p><b>English</b> - We will be on our final week of suspense writing where the children will be creating their own stories.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> - Continuing with the Vikings - comparing the significance of Anglo-Saxon kings during the Viking period.</p> <p><b>Science</b> - Finishing off our evolution and inheritance topic which the children have really enjoyed with an overview of their learning.</p> <p>Please remember that ALL children must have their swimming kit in on a WEDNESDAY and a P.E kit in on a FRIDAY. Maths, grammar and spellings homework is given out on a MONDAY. Maths is to be returned on a FRIDAY and grammar is THURSDAY.</p>

To access Discovery Education Espresso from home

- go to [www.discoveryeducation.co.uk](http://www.discoveryeducation.co.uk)
- click the 'Login' button in the top right corner
- select 'Espresso'
- enter your child's username **student 20801**
- enter your child's password **code123**

**Please note these login details can be used for Coding too, just select Coding rather than Espresso. There are step by step lessons on the Coding service with introductory videos so it should be intuitive.**

### Getting started



Before you start using the service, we recommend reading the *Parents' guide*. This explains what Discovery Education Espresso is, how to use it and how to support your child with their learning. To find the guide visit the *Home learning* area and select the appropriate key stage. The *Parents' guide* button is located in the top left-hand corner of the following page.

Your child should already be familiar with Espresso. They could show you how they have been using it in class and how to find resources. Once you are familiar with the service, you and your child may like to explore Espresso's *Online safety* modules designed to help children develop a better understanding on how to use technology safely and respectfully.
