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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 29/02/16

This week we are assessing the children's progress in Maths and English.

Reception	In Reception next week we will be learning about the artist Kandinsky and drawing our own concentric circles. In Maths we will be learning about numbers to 20 and saying what is one more or one less than a given number to 20. In literacy we will be writing about our favourite animal and creating pictures of the patterns of the animal of our choice. E.g. Zebra, tiger. We will be having a fabulous story telling session on Wednesday by one of our parents who is a professional story teller so we are looking forward to this. Please continue to bring your book bags every day and we look forward to seeing your costumes on World Book Day (Friday 4 th March). The Reception Team.
Year 1	Next week is assessment week. The children will be assessed in reading, writing, and maths. Topic: Our new topic is The Great Outdoors and we will be looking at Epping Forest and comparing it to where we live. We are celebrating World Book Day on Friday 4th March . Please help your child to dress up for the day as their favourite <i>book character</i> !
Year 2	Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be exploring poetry and the use of descriptive language. Cheryl's RML group will be practising their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will continue to look at money and assess the children's understanding. In Science we will be investigating relationship between age of children and size of body part. In Geography we will be using grid references to plan a journey. In Computing children will develop the skills they have been learning in coding to make their own programs. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday. Don't forget our end of year assessment meeting on Tuesday the 1 st of March.
Year 3	Maths: We will be multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. The children will be using their knowledge of place value to help make links when multiplying and dividing. Literacy: Mystery Stories - The children will be planning and writing their own mystery story. Science: This week we will begin to investigate and explore the different parts of a plant and their functions. Topic: We will discuss 'Food Miles' and the environmental impact of transporting food. Reminder: World Book Day is Friday 4 th March. Don't forget to dress up as a character from a book or poem!
Year 4	Maths: This week we will be studying time using 12-hour and 24-hour clocks. English: We will write the end of a story. Science: We will start exploring the topic of Sound. Topic: We will introduce the topic of the Roman Empire. PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement. TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments on the first week back.</u> Homework: Our Greek project is to be completed next week and due in on Wednesday 1 st March. Each child is asked to make a model on any aspect of the Ancient Greece topic e.g. Greek dress (men, women, soldiers, and slaves), homes, 3D map of Ancient Greek vases, the Trojan horse etc.
Year 5	We hope all parents/carers and children had a relaxing half term! Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be converting between kilometres and metres, centimetres and metres, and centimetres and millimetres. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be recognising and writing decimal equivalents to the nearest whole number. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We are recapping mental and formal methods for addition and subtraction and using them to solve problems. English: We will be starting a new unit on poetry and exploring how poets use language for effect. Science: We will compare the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. Topic: We will look at how the Mayas were ruled.
Year 6	Maths - Extend their understanding of the written methods of multiplication and division and perform mental calculations including mixed operations and large numbers. English - The children will explore how a writer can create an atmosphere when describing a setting. Science - Human body: the heart and circulatory system Remember it is World Book day on Friday, however the children still need to bring in their PE kits / swimming costumes as normal.
