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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 06/06/16

Reception	<p>Next half term our topic is food! We will be thinking about healthy eating and making our own food plates and reading 'Oliver's Milkshake'. Jeannie will be singing with us as usual and cooking and gardening clubs will resume. Please sign up for cooking club if you have spare time on Wednesdays at 10.30. Thank you and have a fantastic half term break! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>During the rest of the summer term our topic will be, 'The Deep Blue Sea'.</p> <p>Topic: We will discuss our own personal knowledge and experiences of the seas and oceans around the world. Then, we will identify the location of cold areas of the world. (North and South Poles)</p> <p>Literacy: We will be reading the story, 'Tiddler' by Julia Donaldson. Then, we will explore the character in depth and write a new adventure for this character.</p> <p>Maths: We will be adding two 2-digit numbers, subtracting two 2-digit numbers and applying addition and subtraction strategies to solve problems.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to look at Seasonal Changes and will be keeping a diary of weather and clouds we observe.</p> <p>R.E.: We will be looking at Sikhism and key features of this religion.</p> <p>P.S.H.E.: Theme- 'Changes'. The children will be looking at and discussing, 'some things about me that have changed and some that will not change.'</p> <p>Please remember book bags every day and PE kits on Mondays and Thursdays.</p> <p>We hope you have an enjoyable week.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be looking at the features of instruction writing. In Maths Mastery our topic is Measuring Capacity and Volume. In Science will be seeing what the children have learnt so far in our topic 'Plants' in a mid-term assessment. In our History lesson we will start to look at what it was like to be a child in World War II. In computing we will be recapping children's knowledge of Microsoft word, changing font colour and size. The children have worked very hard in their SAT's so we hope you have a lovely half term.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: The children will continue to develop their knowledge about 'Angles'. They will focus on quadrilaterals, 2d/3d shapes and symmetry.</p> <p>English: Children will begin a new unit that shall focus on Poetry and will investigate poetic features.</p> <p>Topic: This term the focus for these sessions will be 'Where and why does the world rumble?' This week we will be investigating mountain ranges both in Europe and across the world</p> <p>Science: The children will be investigating the durability and permeability of rocks and the density of them.</p> <p>WE NEED PARENT HELPERS IN THE MORNING OF THURSDAY 9TH JUNE FOR A LOCAL TRIP - PLEASE LET THE YEAR 3 STAFF KNOW IF YOU ARE AVAILABLE – THANK YOU.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be studying Roman numerals.</p> <p>English: We will explore features of explanation texts.</p> <p>ART: We will be creating a piece of art about Street Games in 1960s for the Crouch End Art Festival.</p> <p>TOPIC: We will be learning about the legacy of Roman Empire in Britain.</p> <p>SCIENCE: We will be looking how we receive sound from the ear.</p> <p>PE: Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: It is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. This will help considerably with their maths calculations. Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy. Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths:</p> <p><i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will explore the relationship between decimals, fractions and percentages.</p> <p><i>Miss Whight:</i> We will be writing and ordering six-digit numbers and examining negative numbers.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will complete work on fractions and explore the different metric units used to record length and find methods to convert between them.</p> <p>English: We will discuss key features of play-scripts.</p> <p>Science: We will be starting a new topic on 'Animals including Humans'.</p> <p>Topic: We will look closely at identifying major rivers throughout the world.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - We will be focusing on multiplication and division where we will introduce the children to calculator work.</p> <p>English - We will be introducing the children to Shakespeare by looking at scenes in Macbeth.</p> <p>Topic (Science) - We will start a unit on Light.</p>
