NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 03/10/16

Nursery	Continuing with our topic, 'Nursery Rhymes' we will focus on Incy Wincy Spider and Little Miss Muffet whilst making the most of spider season by going on spider hunts in the garden. The Very Busy Spider will be our core book and we will get very busy spinning a giant web of our own using real hammers and nails!
Reception	Next week we will be creating self-portraits using paint, focusing on features of our faces. In Maths we will be exploring repeated patterns and making our own ones using a variety of resources. A free choice reading book will be changed once a week, so please make sure your child brings in their book bag every day. We love to cook in Reception, please look out on a Wednesday for our cooking tin, any donations would be grateful! Have a lovely weekend!
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Information text. We will be using an information text to help us generate verbs to describe actions.</p> <p>Numeracy: We will be combining two sets to find out how many there are altogether, then we will explore addition through number bonds and introduce subtraction by partitioning a set.</p> <p>Science: We will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals.</p> <p>PSHE: We will be exploring positive feelings.</p> <p>Reminders: Book bags every day please. Homework will go home on a Friday, please return by Tuesday.</p>
Year 2	<p>Maths: We will continue to work on number bonds to 20. The children will be adding and subtracting multiples of 10, as well as using their knowledge of number bonds to add to a 2-digit number.</p> <p>Literacy: Next week, the children will begin writing their own versions of <i>The Papaya That Spoke</i>. They will be thinking about alternative characters and settings.</p> <p>Science: The children will be learning about the different types of habitats that can be found in our local area.</p> <p>Geography: We will be discussing the different types of transport used in our local area.</p> <p>*Please ensure your child has their PE kit on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Thank you!</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Children will investigate different ways to partition both 2 and 3 digit numbers.</p> <p>Literacy: Children will begin innovating by planning alternative parts to 'Nail Soup'.</p> <p>Science: Next week, children will be learning about different types of skeletons.</p> <p>Topic: Children will continue investigating the tools and weapons used during the Stone Age.</p> <p>PE: Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays.</p> <p>Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice (x4 for this week!).</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths - We will be studying column addition and expanding our knowledge of working with addition and subtraction word problems.</p> <p>Literacy - We will begin to reinvent our stories based on 'Nail Soup' adding our own twists.</p> <p>Science - We are studying teeth including both human and animal.</p> <p>Topic - We will be studying the Olympics and their origin in Ancient Greece.</p> <p>Picasso will be swimming this week. Please ensure you bring your swim caps.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: The children will be multiplying by 9, 99 using 10, 100 and adjusting.</p> <p>English: We will retelling and adapting the story we have been exploring, 'The Canal'.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to assess the life-cycles of insects.</p> <p>Topic: We will explore where the Anglo-Saxons came from and where they settled.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week.</p> <p>Swimming: Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits. Next week's swimming is Warhol.</p> <p>Homework / Spelling: To be handed out on Monday and needs to be returned on Friday. Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p> <p>Parents Meeting: Thank you very much too all parents that attended the event. If you have any further queries, please do not hesitate to approach either of us.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - We will be exploring shape including drawing and constructing nets for 3-D shapes.</p> <p>English - We will be reading and creating warning stories using drama and published texts.</p> <p>Science - We will be continuing with evolution and inheritance focusing on exploring the causes of adaptation which sometimes leads to evolution.</p> <p>Homework - Your child will be given spellings and a grammar book on Monday. Please ensure the grammar homework is returned to school by Thursday.</p>
