



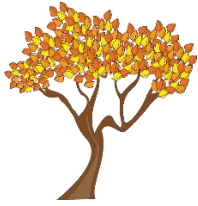

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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 05/10/15

Reception	<p>Next week we will be looking at recipes and how are they different from story books? What do we use recipes for? We will continue exploring different letter formations and practising writing our names. In maths will be looking at 2D shapes and their properties and creating repeated patterns. We will also be focusing on numbers 1-10, placing them in order. P.E in Reception takes place on a Wednesday afternoon and Friday morning. A P.E kit is not required. Children will take off socks and shoes during our P.E sessions. Please look out for the cooking tin for donations towards ingredients, we love to cook in reception and would like to do this each week. Hope you have a lovely weekend! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>English: Information text. We will be using an information text to help us generate verbs to describe actions. Numeracy: To use the language of addition accurately, recognise the “whole” and “parts” in an addition equation. Topic: We will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals. PSHE: We will be exploring positive feelings. <i>Reminders: Book bags every day please. Homework will go home on a Friday, please return by Tuesday.</i></p>
Year 2	<p>Julie’s Language and Literacy group will be borrowing pieces from ‘Sister for Sale’ to build their own story. RML will continue. In Maths Mastery we will start the new unit of addition and subtraction, starting with the children’s knowledge of number bonds within 20. In Science we will be look at what animals live in the habitats around our school and the reasons why. In Geography we will be looking at the life of a banana. As it is Black History Month we will be focusing on Bessie Coleman as an inspiration to enable us to ‘Be the Best we can Be’. In Computing we will be using our new skills in Word to produce a piece of writing. During our Art lesson we will be producing detailed pictures of mini beasts. Don’t forget book bags every day, particularly Wednesday and Thursday. Children need their P.E kits for P.E on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Multiplication and division (including number and place value) - The children will be solving word problems using these calculations. English: Non-fiction - We will be learning about information texts and the children will write their own text about holidays and day trips. Topic: The children will look at the time line for the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age, discussing the relationship. P.E: Please ensure children bring their kits on Wednesday/Thursday. Please support your children with regular reading, homework and times table practise.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will studying symmetry in 2-D shapes and recognising symmetry in the environment. English: We will be exploring features of information texts. Science: We will continue to study animals and their habitats. P.E: Tuesday and Friday (Sekoto class), Thursday and Friday (Picasso class). These will be alternate sessions of P.E and swimming but this is subject to change so all children need to bring both swimming and P.E kits each week. Homework: Homework will be given out on Fridays. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesdays. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: The children will be multiplying numbers mentally drawing upon known facts. English: We will be developing our writing by creating vivid images using description and comparison. Science: We will be conducting an investigation seeking to find out how quickly different sugars dissolve in boiling water. Topic: We will explore what life was like for the average Anglo-Saxon in their villages and how they lived day to day. P.E: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and P.E kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their P.E kits. Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths: Multiplying TO x TO using the formal written method and solve word problems. English: Continue to write a quest story. Science: Study Charles Darwin and his theory of evolution. Topic: California's huge diversity. P.E/Swimming will take place on Friday. Please can you ensure your child has <u>both</u> kits on this day. Homework is given out on a Monday and must be handed in later that week. Grammar and spelling - Thursday, Maths - Friday.</p>
