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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

## Week Beginning: 09/11/15

<b>Reception</b>	<p>Next week we will be focusing on the celebration of 'Diwali'. We will be making our very own divas (candle holders) and rangoli/mendhi patterns for our display. In maths we will be focusing on estimation and numbers within 10. On writing day we will be writing about which celebration we enjoy, eg; Halloween, Diwali, Hanukkah, Christmas etc.. Please look out for the money tin, any donations towards ingredients would be great! Have a lovely weekend.</p>
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy</b> – Narrative: Stories with patterned and predictable text from a range of cultures. <i>Too Much Talk</i>, by Angela Medearis. Children will be orally retelling the story using storyboards and then writing sentences for the beginning, middle and end.</p> <p><b>Numeracy</b> – We will be representing addition and subtraction word problems using a bar model. We will then be representing two step word problems for addition and subtraction again using a bar model.</p> <p><b>Science</b> – observe and describe weather associated with the seasons (outdoor learning).</p> <p><b>RE/Design and Technology/Art:</b> Rangoli window decorations and continuing our firework pictures.</p> <p><b>Geography:</b> Learning about the four countries which make up the United Kingdom.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p>Julie’s Language and Literacy group will continue to explore poetic techniques and look in particular at the form of shape poems. RML will continue. In Maths Mastery we will start the new topic of length. During our Science session will be looking at the way animals adapt to the habitat they live in. In Geography we will be looking at the world and the continents. In Computing children will be making anti-bullying posters in preparation for anti-bullying week starting the 16<sup>th</sup> November. In R.E we will celebrate the values of being part of a family. Don’t forget book bags every day, particularly Wednesday and Thursday. Children need their P.E kits for P.E on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Place Value - The children will be reading, writing, partitioning and ordering 3-digit numbers. We will also be adding and subtracting 10 and 100 from a 3-digit number.</p> <p><b>Literacy:</b> We will be starting a new science fiction/fantasy unit based on humorous story called <i>A Tale of Two Robots</i>.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> The children will be learning about Reflective Surfaces.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will be describing and identifying uses of technology in the local area.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on Wednesdays/Thursdays.</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> This week we will be working with multiplication and division facts.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will be continuing to explore stories with dilemmas.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> Our topic on Ancient Greece will continue with exploring a map of the country and relevant time events.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> This term PE will be on Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure your child has an appropriate change of kit for these lessons. This is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p><b>Music:</b> <b>Both classes have made a fantastic start in learning to play their instruments. As music is an important part of your child’s curriculum, please ensure that instruments are brought to school for these lessons.</b></p> <p><b>Trips:</b> <b><u>Letters for the Cinema trip need to be submitted by Monday.</u></b></p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Homework will be given out on Fridays. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesdays. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Mr Mattocks’ class will be reading and writing numbers as fractions. Miss Whight’s class will be investigating time.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will be making connections between myths.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will be starting a new topic on Earth and Space. The children will be learning a mnemonic which will help them to order the planets.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will be investigating our local landmarks.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
<b>Year 6</b>	<p><b>Maths</b> - adding and subtracting whole numbers and decimals using the formal written method.</p> <p><b>English</b> - write a biography on the life of Walter Tull.</p> <p><b>Topic</b> - compare the significance of the Anglo-Saxon Kings with those from the Viking period.</p> <p><b>Science</b> - continue studying fossils and how they show the evolution of species over time.</p> <p><b>PE/Swimming</b> will take place on a Friday afternoon. Please ensure your child brings the appropriate kit. Have a wonderful holiday!</p>
