### Library books

## Week Beginning: 12/10/15

| <b>Reception</b> | <p>Next week we are focusing on our class artist creating pieces of work for the school calendar. In maths we will be consolidating what we have done so far with 2D shapes, their properties and repeated patterns. For writing we will be focusing on our favourite hobbies, and writing about them. We will also be cooking so please look out for the tin, donations would be appreciated! Please make sure your child comes to school in their school uniform everyday. Thank you, the reception team.</p>  |
| <b>Year 1</b>    | <p>Literacy – Narrative (Stories with familiar settings): We will be reading <i>Grace and Family</i> by Mary Hoffman. The children will be generating adjectives to describe a member of their family (qualities and appearance). They will then use these words to write sentences about their families.</p> <p>Numeracy – <i>introduce subtraction equations</i>: We will be subtracting by taking away, using the language of subtraction accurately and we will be finding the missing part in a subtraction equation.</p> <p>Science – We will be identifying and naming common varieties of birds.</p> <p>PSHE (Black History Month): We are looking at “The People’s Underground” and how it relates to freedom.</p> <p>Art (Black History Month): We will be designing and making a class quilt using our knowledge of a Freedom Quilt and symbols (bow tie pattern).</p> <p><i>Reminders: Please make sure your child’s clothing is clearly labelled with their name.</i></p> |
| <b>Year 2</b>    | <p>Julie’s Language and Literacy group will be looking at information about how animals care for their young and looking at explanations of life cycles. RML will continue. In Maths Mastery we will be starting addition of numbers within 100 and towards the end of the week adding two digit numbers. In Science we will be making a wanted poster of a mini beast, describing its characteristics and in particular where it lives. In History we will look at why we celebrate Black History Month and studying the book ‘The Patchwork Plan’. During our Art lesson we will use our new understanding of patchwork quilts to design our own. In Computing we will continue to use our new skills in word to produce a piece of writing. Don’t forget book bags every day, particularly Wednesday and Thursday and children need their P.E kits for P.E on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>  |
| <b>Year 3</b>    | <p>Maths: Fractions - The children will be learning about how to find fractions, add fractions and they will be solving problems involving fractions.</p> <p>Literacy: Fiction - The children will be looking at play scripts and exploring the characters and their actions.</p> <p>Science: The children will find out about different types of skeletons.</p> <p>Topic: We will be learning about how the Bronze Age began in Britain.</p> <p>PE: Please ensure children bring their kits on Wednesday/Thursday.</p> <p>Please support your children with regular reading, homework and times table practise.</p>   |
| <b>Year 4</b>    | <p><b>Maths:</b> We will continue to study symmetry with reflective symmetry activities and repeating patterns.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will continue to work with information texts, gathering facts about a subject and organising it clearly in an informative way.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will continue to study animals and their habitats.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Tuesday and Friday (Sekoto class), Thursday and Friday (Picasso class). These will be alternate sessions of PE and swimming but this is subject to change so all children need to bring both swimming and PE kits each week.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Homework will be given out on Fridays. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesdays. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p>   |
| <b>Year 5</b>    | <p><b>Maths:</b> We will be investigating fractions.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will be writing a story ending to a modern day myth.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will be recording results from our practical activity.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will explore what life was like for the average Anglo-Saxon in their villages and how they lived day to day.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Monday and Tuesday - Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. Tuesday, the children will need their PE kits.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>  |
| <b>Year 6</b>    | <p>Maths - We will be focusing on fractions: simplifying, finding equivalent fractions and ordering fractions.</p> <p>English - It will be the final week of writing our quest stories.</p> <p>Science - Reviewing what we have learnt so far - quiz time!</p> <p>Topic - Our focus will be Black History Month where the children will be creating a quilt based on secret codes.</p> <p>P.E/Swimming will take place on a Friday so please can you ensure your child has the appropriate kit.</p> <p>Year 6 visit the school library every Thursday. All children need to bring in their library books on this day so they can exchange or renew.</p> <p>Please encourage your child to practise all multiplication facts on a daily basis.</p>  |
