Next week, our school will be taking part in **UK Road Safety Week**, coordinated by Brake, the road safety charity. The school council have written a letter to our local councillor asking them to invest in measures to help slow down traffic on Nightingale Lane. If you agree with this letter you can sign a petition which will be in the playground next week which will be sent with the letter.

Throughout the school we will be discussing road safety with the children, in an assembly and in class workshops. We will be talking about using roads safely by following the Green Cross Code; about the dangers of fast traffic; and about how walking and cycling is good for our health and the environment. On Friday children can dress up in stripy clothes or their brightest to raise money in support of Brake's mascot Zak the Zebra.
