#### Road Safety Week Competition

As you know this week we have been discussing road safety with the children, in assembly and in class workshops. Attached to your newsletter are some simple activities for you to enjoy doing with your children, which will provide the opportunity for you to reinforce the following key messages at home as well.

- cross roads safely with your child and teach them the Green Cross Code
- make sure your child holds an adult's hand around roads until they are at least eight
- help your child learn about safe walking/cycling routes in the area, especially any traffic-free paths or quiet roads with slow traffic and good pavements
- if you drive, protect children (and adults) by slowing down and going 20mph or below around homes, schools and shops



#### School Council Letter to our Local Councillors

Our School Council have written the following letter to our local councillors asking them to invest in measures to help slow down traffic on Nightingale Lane. Next week members of our school council will be in the playground collecting signatures from parents who support their ideas so that a petition can be sent with the letter.

Dear Councillors, Adam Jodie, Jennifer Mann, Elin Western,

We are strongly encouraging you to improve the safety of our fellow pupils and peers, while they cross the many roads around Campsbourne primary school. Our school council have discussed many solutions that could solve any outstanding issues in our local area concerning the safety of everyone. We have got a series of recommendations that could be implemented to ensure that we are all safe:

Firstly, a zebra crossing should be introduced directly next to our school on Nightingale Lane. This would enable large groups of children with their adults or legal guardians to cross the busy road without anxiety, worry or fear. Moreover, Campsbourne councillors have unanimously agreed that lollipop men or women should be assigned to zebra crossings around our school to assist adults crossing them with large numbers of very young children. We have noticed that parents/carers can find this particularly challenging before and after school, as they often have their hands full and are anxious to make sure that their child or children get to school on time. This would support them at stressful times of the day, especially, if they have to venture onwards onto work after dropping their child off. Finally, we advise that electrical speed limit signs are put on the side of roads. These should be set at around 20mph, as this is a safe driving speed. These signs will reduce the speed of passing cars and limit the risk of an innocent pedestrian being struck by a driver driving irresponsibly.

In conclusion, we believe that all three of these proposals would support our local area and make roads safer. Ultimately, they are all cost-effective and relatively easy to introduce – we really hope that you consider all of these suggestions. We look forward to hearing from you soon.
