#### A Parent Review of Year 2 Trip to the National Art Gallery

The National Gallery trip was great. The kids were very attentive and interested and the guide from the National Gallery was really good. The guide started by telling the children that all the paintings belonged to them as did the mummies in the British Museum and the dinosaurs in the Natural History Museum which they liked the idea of and there was some discussion about where they would have space for a dinosaur skeleton if they took one home! This is one of the paintings we looked at. We talked about this painting which the whole school have been looking at this term as part of a National Gallery scheme called 'Take One Picture'.



The children found it hilarious to think about a time before TV when travelling scientists would come to family homes to perform experiments to show people about current advances in science. Some of the children stood up to recreate the picture and they discussed the different reactions of members of the audience in the painting.
