## Habitats and Seasonal Change

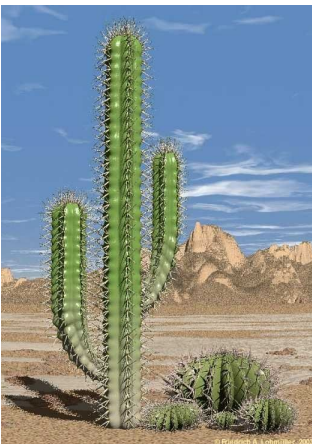
Habitats we will be focusing on...
