Open Mornings



Campsbourne Supporting Tottenham Foodbank this Harvest

Thank you to everyone who has made donations to our harvest appeal so far. This year we're asking you to help feed local people in crisis by collecting tinned and dried food for the Tottenham foodbank. We are asking everyone to rally round to give items such as breakfast cereals, pasta sauces, tinned veg, tomatoes, meat, rice and sponge pudding, sugar, UHT milk, fruit juice and pasta. Many families struggle to put food on the table but the good news is that you can be part of the solution. The foodbank helps local individuals and families in crisis through the provision of emergency food supplies donated by churches, schools, businesses and the general public. With 1 in 5 people living in poverty



in the UK, people are going hungry in their own homes so we need to do much better. Please join with us by giving food so that local people in need don't go hungry. Thank you. NB: Please make sure all food is unopened, non-perishable, in date, and undamaged. There are drop off points in both the infant and junior school halls.
