# Start and Finish Times

# Swimming Kit

The children will be in groups of no more than 10 children.

# Forest School

Forest School now takes place for an entire term.

Year 1 – Autumn Term

#### Clothing

To allow the pupils to participate fully the correct clothing is essential for Forest School. All children need to bring a change of clothes:

- Wellingtons
- Long trousers/ long sleeved top
- Jumper/Sweatshirt
- Waterproof coat and trousers
- Hat, gloves and thick socks

#### Snack

- A water bottle (which can be reused)
- A piece of fruit





- Across the school we teach literacy through our Talk for Writing program.
- Enables children to imitate the key language they need for a particular topic orally before they try reading and analysing it.
- Through fun activities that help them rehearse the tune of the language they need, followed by shared writing to show them how to craft their writing, children are helped to write in the same style.

In years 1 and 2, we teach the Maths Mastery program to the children. This approach to teaching maths ensures that children develop a deeper conceptual understanding over time through concrete and abstract learning opportunities.

# Reading

Children grouped across the year 1.



Sounds Write Books are used each session – decodable and inline with the children's phonic knowledge.

Key vocabulary focus – expanding children's knowledge of words they may not come across everyday

Children read with a partner and independently across the week.

Daily comprehension sessions

There is lots of reinforcement of key words because children are reading them everyday.

The books are enjoyable stories which encourage children to read for pleasure.

In this way children are reading daily, learning to enjoy books, building their confidence, increasing their reading mileage, developing comprehension and building on their bank of high frequency words.

Your child will bring home a decodable phonics book to share with you each week – I READ



Sounds-Write is a quality first phonics programme and is how we teach reading, spelling and writing.

Children receive daily Sounds-Write lessons.

Taught in Reception and KS1, then fine-tuned throughout the rest of Key Stage 2.

In Reception and Year 1 the focus is very much on reading and spelling.

In Year 2 to Year 6 the lessons focus on spelling.

In addition, it also serves very successfully as an intervention or catchup programme.

## Wider Curriculum Overview

- Religious Education: Christianity, The Creation Story

## Assessment (Year 1 and Year 2)

- Children in Year 1 and Year 2 will be teacher assessed in reading, writing and maths during lessons against the national curriculum objectives.
- All Year 1 children are required to sit a national Phonics test in June 2024.
