Maths



White Rose Maths is our KS2 program to teach maths.

In years 3 to 6, we teach the White Rose Maths program to the children. This approach to teaching maths ensures that children develop:

- a deeper conceptual understanding over time through concrete and abstract learning opportunities
- opportunities to apply mathematical concepts to a wide range of problem solving and reasoning problems.

- In KS2, knowing times tables will help your child enormously with all of their learning in Maths.

Reading

Destination Reader (DR)

Destination Reader is our KS2 program to teach reading.

Takes place 4 days a week, 10.30am to 11.15am

All staff are trained to deliver the lesson in the same way to ensure consistency.

Destination Reader focuses on various strategies that help children to become more fluent in their reading, and helps develop a love of reading.

There is lots of reinforcement of key words because children are reading them everyday.

The books are enjoyable texts which encourage children to read for pleasure.

Destination Reader

Day 1	Whole class look at a book together, there is lots of teacher modelling and group discussions in order to show the children how to use the focus strategy.
Day 2	
Day 3	Children read different books depending on their reading ability. They will be using the skills they have learnt during the teacher input in order to apply the focus strategy to a new, unfamiliar text.
Day 4	Big Picture lesson / Unseen comprehension. The children will use all of the skills they have learnt throughout the week to complete a reading comprehension.

Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader is used in KS2 to promote reading mileage at home and within school

- MOST books within school have a code on them
- Children can use this code to complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader
- If your child achieves 80% or more in 10 quizzes, they will earn a certificate
- Please note: Not all books are on the Accelerated Reader system, so your child can not be tested on all books they read.
- Children will have the opportunity to let their class teacher know they are ready to complete an Accelerated Reader quiz (at school) using a class tablet (time permitting) or during designated slots in assembly times.

Writing



- Across the school we teach literacy through our Talk for Writing program.
- Enables children to imitate the key language they need for a particular topic orally before they try reading and analysing it.
- Through fun activities that help them rehearse the tune of the language they need, followed by shared writing to show them how to craft their writing, children are helped to write in the same style.

Sounds-Write is a quality first phonics programme and is how we teach reading, spelling and writing.

Children receive daily 15 minute Sounds-Write lessons.

In Year 2 to Year 6 the lessons focus on spelling.

In addition, it also serves very successfully as an intervention or catch-up programme.

Spelling challenge every Friday.

Weekly challenges

- Spelling challenge (Fridays) Spellings will be sent out on a Friday, (after we have explored them as a class that week)
- Times Tables Challenge (Wednesdays) The children progress through all the times tables at their own speed and earn badges)
- Arithmetic Quiz Wednesday maths lessons have an arithmetic focus. We will be working on the children's recall, fluency and use of appropriate and effective strategies.

Assessment (Years 3 to 6)

- We have two main assessments weeks in the school. These take place at the end of Autumn 2 and in Summer 2.
- During these assessment weeks, the children will complete assessment papers in Reading, Maths and SPAG.
- Teachers then use these to inform their teacher judgements.
- These help to inform us of gaps in the children's knowledge so that we can plan for them effectively.
- Writing is teacher assessed.



Please make sure your child has the appropriate swimming kit or they may not be able to participate.


Forest School

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Homework / Home learning

- Homework (letters on a Friday) suggested activities to support learning in school. (No expectation for these to be returned)
- Spellings and handwriting
- Quick maths/recall of number facts (WRM app, Hit the Button)
- Multiplication tables (TTRS, Hit the Button)
- Reading (listening to and reading to)
- Talking and playing games (cards, chess, board games).

Food policy

Last year we updated our food policy, you should know...

"The following items are not allowed and will be confiscated:

Fizzy drinks,

Crisps of any sort

Confectionery such as chocolate bars, chocolate-coated biscuits, chocolate spread, sweets, lolly pops and chewing gum."

"Birthdays

We want to give children the opportunity to celebrate their birthdays and we do so with special cards, assemblies and other activities to help make children feel special on their birthday.

The school <u>has decided not to allow</u> sweets, fizzy drinks, cakes, biscuits and party bags to be brought and given out to children during school hours on their birthday.

This is to reduce the amount of high fat; sugar and salt foods children eat and prevent children being excluded due to allergies or special diets.

We are therefore asking that parents/carers do not send in these items to school on children's birthdays.

If parents want to bring something in to celebrate birthdays we ask that healthy foods such as fruit be brought in. Alternatively non-food items are a good alternative or even bringing in a special book for the class to read is a good option, instead of cakes or sweets."

Pick Up

- Children should not be using the play equipment and climbing frames before or after school.
