- Across the school we teach literacy through our Talk for Writing program.
- Enables children to imitate the key language they need for a particular topic orally before they try reading and analysing it.
- Through fun activities that help them rehearse the tune of the language they need, followed by shared writing to show them how to craft their writing, children are helped to write in the same style.

In years 3 to 6, we teach the White Rose maths program to the children. This approach to teaching maths ensures that children develop a deeper conceptual understanding over time through concrete and abstract learning opportunities whilst also having the opportunity to apply mathematical concepts to a wide range of problem solving and reasoning problems.



Sounds-Write is a quality first phonics programme and is how we teach reading, spelling and writing.

Children receive daily Sounds-Write lessons.

Ideally it will be introduced in YR, taught in KS1 and fine-tuned throughout the rest of Key Stage 2.

In Reception and Year 1 these focus very much on reading and spelling.

In Year 2 to Year 6 the lessons focus on spelling. From Autumn 2, we will follow the Sounds Write scheme.

In addition, it also serves very successfully as an intervention or catch-up programme.

Destination Reader

Destination Reader is our KS2 program to teach reading.

Takes place Monday to Thursday.

All staff are trained to deliver the lesson in the same way to ensure consistency.

Destination Reader focuses on various strategies that help children to become more fluent in their reading, and helps develop a love of reading.

There is lots of reinforcement of key words because children are reading them everyday.

The books are enjoyable stories which encourage children to read for pleasure.

Destination Reader

Monday	Whole class look at a book together, there is lots of teacher modelling and group discussions in order to
Tuesday	show the children how to use the focus strategy.
Wednesday	Children read their own book from the library independently.
Thursday	Big Picture lesson. The children will use all of the skills they have learnt throughout the week to answer questions using a PEE (point, evidence, explain) format.

Accelerated Reader

Accelerated reader is used in KS2 to promote reading at home and within school

- MOST books within school have a code on them
- Children can use this code to complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader <u>https://ukhosted34.renlearn.co.uk/2243369/</u>
- If your child achieves 80% or more, they will earn a certificate in celebration assembly
- Once your child has received 10 certificates, they will order a book of their choice through Mr Smith (The books they earn certificates for, must be at their appropriate levels)
- Please note: Not all books are on the Accelerated reader system, so your child can not be tested on all books they read.
- Children will have the opportunity to complete Accelerated reader quizzes using a class tablet.

Please ask your child to let us know if they have forgotten their log in details.

Assessment (Years 3 to 6)

- We complete weekly arithmetic tests to develop children's fluency, confidence and aid their reasoning skills.
- Children will sit written assessments at the end of each term.

On the bottom half children can wear clothes of their own choice.


They can also choose what type of footwear e.g. trainers. Sandals with buckles or other fasteners are allowed.
